ORDINANCE NO. 2020-34

**AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE SALARY FOR THE POSITION OF WELLSTON CITY SAFETY/ SERVICE DIRECTOR AND WAIVING THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT.**

WHEREAS, the legislative authority for the City of Wellston desires to increase the salary for the position of City Safety/ Service Director, and;

WHEREAS, the legislative authority further desires to waive the residency requirement for the position of City Safety/ Service Director, pursuant to ORC 737.01, and;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF WELLSTON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:


**Section One:** The salary for the position of City of Wellston Safety/ Service Director is increased and hereby set at \$45,000.00 to \$55,000.00 per year to be negotiated based upon experience, and;

**Section Two:** Pursuant to ORC 737.01, the residency requirement for the City of Wellston Safety/ Service Director is hereby waived and instead it shall be required that any individual appointed as Safety/ Service Director live within a 15 minute drive of any corporation limit of the City of Wellston, and;

**Section Three:** Any and all other benefits or compensation currently afforded the position of of City Safety/ Service Director shall remain unchanged' and;

**Section Four:** It is hereby found and determined that all formal acts of this council concerning and relating to adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council and the deliberations of the council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
